No. 4 at Triple Base gallery is pleased to present ***WHITE BOX and 24<sup>th</sup> STREET PROMENADE***. These two inaugural exhibitions are the first in a series of six months of art programming by curatorial collective No.4 at Triple Base gallery. For ***WHITE BOX***, 40 artists from all over the country will customize an artwork that fits into a 12'' X 9'' gift box. At the opening of the show, the gallery will be filled with the unmarked white boxes wherein attendees of the opening are offered a ticket that assigns them to one at random. The buyer then unwraps the box by lifting the lid and is presented with an object made and donated by the artist. The exhibition will slowly be unveiled and by the end of the evening, all of the boxes will be opened and the works will be displayed for the remainder of the two-week show.
